### **QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

Q. 420 days – is there winter shutdown?

A. The special provision entitled "Contract Time and Liquidated Damages" states that Three Hundred Ninety Nine (399) calendar days are allowed for the contract. Form 816 and the special provision "Section 1.08 Prosecution and Progress" states that the contract includes a winter shutdown.

Q. What does the statement "(\*) – Indicates Cost Plus Time Site. See schedule of Items for Cost Per Unit" mean?

A. "(\*) - Indicates Cost Plus Time Site. See Schedule of Items for Cost Per Unit", which appears on the Bid Proposal would be to indicate "Cost Plus Time" bidding, commonly referred to as "A+B" bidding. No Items on the Bid Proposal include the single asterisk (\*), and the department is not seeking "A+B" bidding.

The item entitled "Item No. 1806200 Furnishing and Use of Portable Impact Attenuation System" is hereby revised to include the item alternate on the bid proposal form.

The Detailed Estimate Sheet does not reflect this change.

The Bid Proposal Form has been revised to reflect this change.

There will be no change in the number of calendar days due to this Addendum.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rate.

#### Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union rates, LA

indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
