

**LEGAL NOTICE – CONSULTANT SELECTION  
FEDERAL LOCAL BRIDGE PROGRAM**

**LEGAL NOTICE:** The City of Norwalk, CT seeks to engage a Consulting Engineering firm to provide construction inspection services for the following transportation project:

**Westmere Avenue Bridge Superstructure Replacement**, ConnDOT Project No. 102-315, Federal Aid No. 6102(004) – The project includes the removal of the existing 37.5 foot span superstructure and replacement with a new steel stringer and cast in place concrete deck. Estimated construction duration is 365 calendar days with an estimated construction cost of \$1,350,000.

The Consulting Engineer will be evaluated and selected based on technical competence, the capacity and capability to perform the work, past record of performance, and knowledge of Federal, State and City procedures, approximately weighted in descending order of importance.

The construction inspection fee will be negotiated on a cost – plus basis.

Firms responding to this request should be of adequate size and sufficiently staffed to perform the assignments described above.

None (0%) of the construction inspection work must be subcontracted to Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE).

The selected firm must meet all City, State and Federal affirmative action and equal employment opportunity practices.

Three (3) copies of a letter of interest, together with general information on the firm and proposed subconsultants, the firm's brochure, current Federal GSA Form 330, experience of the firm and a resume of key personnel should be address to Mr. Richard P. Additionally, all interested firms must submit a detailed statement including the organizational structure under which the firm proposes to conduct business. Proposed subconsultants should be clearly identified. The relationship to any "parent" firm or subsidiary firm, with any of the parties concerned, must be clearly identified.

Personnel in responsible charge of the project will be required to posses and maintain a valid Connecticut professional Engineer's License.

All letters of interest must be postmarked by a U.S. Postal Office (if mailed) or received in the City of Norwalk Department of Public Works Office, Room 225, City Hall, 125 East Avenue, Norwalk, CT 06856-5125, (if hand delivered), no later than 4:00 P.M. on April 24, 2013. Responses received or postmarked after this date will not be considered.
