Fitch High School) Groton, CT until 2:00 p.m., prevailing time, on November 14, 2019, and then at said office publicly opened and read aloud. Bids must be enclosed in a sealed envelope and designated as bid for "Colonel Ledyard School Underground Oil Storage Tank Removal".

Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the above scheduled time for opening of bids. Any bid received after the time and date specified will be returned unopened.

The deposit amount will be returned provided the Contract Documents are returned in good condition within ten (10) days after the bid opening.

A non-mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held at Colonel Ledyard School (120 West Street, Groton, CT 06340) on October 29, 2019 at 10:00am.

Each bidder must deposit, with his bid, security in the form of bid bond or certified check subject to the conditions provided in the Information for Bidders.
